Transformation of Supply Chains Amidst Industry 4.0


Traditional supply chains were linear, dealing with the procurement, costs and flow of physical goods and materials.



Workforce for Contemporary Supply Chains



Pedagogy, Programme Delivery & Schedule

Pedagogy

- ◆ A mix of lectures, case-based discussions and simulation games.
- ◆ Participants are required to read various course materials (a mix of class lecture notes and pre-reads), assimilate and participate in the class discussions.
- ◆ Course evaluation will involve an online exam for each module.
- ◆ Participants will be expected to participate in business simulation games that will involve application of the concepts/models learnt in the programme.
- ◆ Participants will get an exposure to Microsoft Excel while solving several supply chain problems.
- ◆ Participants will also be asked to undertake an application project (preferably from the organisation where they are working) to demonstrate the understanding of the concepts learnt in this programme.



Programme Delivery

- ◆ Hybrid mode of delivery with two in-campus modules and the rest delivered in a synchronous learning mode via a studio infrastructure
- ◆ The two in-campus visits will be of 3 days each at the mid and end of the programme, at IIM Tiruchirappalli campus*
- ◆ The synchronous learning classes will be spread over 45 weeks with typically 3 hours of contact time per week
- ◆ Online classes will be held over Direct-to-Device (D-2-D) platform wherein online interactive lectures get delivered to your desktop/laptop/mobile

Eligibility Requirements

- ◆ Bachelor's degree, with at least 50% marks or equivalent CGPA (45% in case of the candidates belonging to SC/ST/PWD) awarded by
 - a. Universities incorporated by an act of the central or state legislature in India or other educational institutions established by an act of Parliament or,
 - b. Institutions declared to be deemed as a University under Section 3 of the UGC Act, 1956, or,
 - c. Possess an equivalent qualification recognised by the Ministry of HRD, Government of India
- ◆ Minimum post-qualification experience of 3 years is desirable
- ◆ Reservations will be provided to eligible candidates as per Government of India norms
